## THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF JEWELLERS EDUCATIONAL TRUST GRANT SCHEME 2018

#### Introduction

The National Association of Goldsmiths Centenary Trust was founded in 1994 and is regulated by the Charities Commission. As part of its objectives it aims to promote education within the trade by facilitating the availability of courses and study to as wide a range of students as possible. The Trust became the National Association of Jewellers Educational Trust in 2015 after the unification of the National Association of Goldsmiths with the British Jewellers Association to become The National Association of Jewellers.

The NAJ Educational Trust undertakes this educational objective in three ways: The Bursary Scheme; the Loan Scheme; and the Apprenticeship Scheme. Eligible students or employers may apply for grant funding to any of these three schemes as appropriate.

The Bursary Scheme allows students to directly apply to the Trustees for funding, most usually for the JET Diploma course, but other courses are considered. It applies to students who are unable to fund their studies, either themselves or via their employer, but who have a commitment to making their career in the jewellery trade.

The Loan Scheme has been introduced to help students who are employed within a multiple retailing group and whose employer is happy to reimburse the student for the cost of their studies once they have been successfully completed and passed. The Trustees will loan the student the money for the cost of their JET Diploma course, or similar, to be repaid to the Trustees by the employer on successful completion.

The Scholarship Apprentice (Training) Scheme is to aid employers with the cost of training an apprentice. The application can be made conjunction with an organisation such as the Hand Engravers Association or the Goldsmiths' Centre, or directly to the Trustees by the employer and the proposed apprentice. Funding will usually be tapered over the period of the proposed apprenticeship and the Trustees will need to have sight of the apprentice's contract of service.

#### 01. NAJ Educational Trust Bursary Scheme

01.01	General Students apply directly to the Trustees of <i>The Trust</i> for bursaries, as has been the case over previous years.
01.02	The Agreement:
01.02.01	The Trust generally awards half of any JET Diploma application cost to the student.
01.02.02	The JET Certificate course tutor will normally recommend the student to take the JET Diploma course.
01.02.03	Bursaries, other than for the JET Diploma course, are considered on the merits of each application.

#### 02. NAJ Educational Trust Loan Scheme

#### 02.01 General

This Scheme is most appropriately applied to Multiple Retailing Groups' students, whose employers are content to fully reimburse *The NAJ Educational Trust* (hereinafter known as "*The Trust*") once they have passed their course. This loan agreement usually applies to JET Diploma students.

- 02.02 The Agreement:
- 02.02.01 The Trust will provide the full cost of the JET Diploma course to suitable students, recommended by either their JET Certificate course tutor or their employer, as a loan.
- O2.02.02 At the same time the employer will guarantee to return the loan sum to *The Trus*t within 21 days of notification of the successful completion of the course.
- 02.02.03 If the student fails either to pass or to complete the course, then the employer agrees to return half of the loan sum, to *The Trust*, within 21 days of notification to *The Trust*. If any monies are not returned within this period interest will be charged at 4% above the Barclays Bank base rate at that date.

03. NAJ Educ	cational Trust Scholarship Apprentice (Training) Scheme
03.01	General
	A range of organisations, including but not restricted to the Hand Engravers Association, WOSTEP, Clockmakers, West Dean College, Goldsmiths Centre etc. can apply for funding to train a named apprentice or student. This could also be an award part-funded in association with other funding bodies.
03.02	The Agreement:
03.02.01	This award may cover several years.
03.02.02	The award will not usually be returned to <i>The Trus</i> t.
03.02.03	If the award is for an apprenticeship, the award will usually be tapered, over the period of the apprenticeship, to reflect the increasing use of the apprentice to the employer.
03.02.04	If the award is for an apprenticeship, the employer will usually make the application to <i>The Trust</i> and the apprentice's contract of service must be made available to <i>The Trust</i> before any award is agreed or paid.
03.02.05	If the award is for an apprenticeship, payments will be made on an annual basis in advance, directly to the employer. Any unused portion of an award will be returned to <i>The Trust</i> , if the apprenticeship were to cease, within one month.
03.02.06	In all cases, an annual progress report will be required to be made to <i>The Trust</i> together with a report and evidence of payments for his or her training during that year e.g. pay slips, college fees etc.
03.02.07	Employers will also inform the <i>NAJ Educational Trustees</i> of any prize(s) that might be awarded to the apprentice during the award period and allow <i>The Trustees</i> to use this information as publicity for <i>The Trust</i> as required. It will be a condition of the award to give the consent of both the apprentice and employer to allow this publicity.

- O3.02.08 Any Scholarship Apprentice Scheme award made by *The Trust* will be purely at the discretion of *The Trustees* and will be referred to as a *NAJ Educational Trust* Scholarship. Such an award will take the form of a contract between the *NAJ Educational Trust* and the Employer of the apprentice or student.
- O3.02.09 Apprentices or students should be referred to as an *NAJ Education and Charitable Trust*Scholarship Apprentice in any publicity or competition applications made during the period of the award.
- 03.02.10 If during the period of the award the employer were to cease trading or the employment of the apprentice were to cease for any reason then all outstanding monies from the award, for which receipts for training are not in existence at that time, are liable to be returned to the NAJ Educational Trust. In the case of bankruptcy or administration of the employer then The Trust should be entered as a creditor by the administrators. In all other cases such as where employment of the apprentice or student ends all outstanding monies are to be returned to The Trust within 21 days of ceasation of the contract of employment.

#### 04. Terms & Conditions

- O4.01.01 Awards granted under the *NAJ Educational Trust* Grant Scheme as outlined above are made subject to the details contained herein regarding the three separate schemes.
- O4.01.02 Awards made are according to *The Trust's* objectives and subject to the Declaration of Trust dated 13 June 1994.
- 04.01.03 The *NAJ Educational Trust* Grant Scheme and awards shall in all respects be governed by and construed in accordance with English Law.
